



Introduction

This year CensusAtSchool becomes competitive with the launch of our new questionnaire sponsored by Winton Capital Management. Take part as normal, see the brief guide below, and then enter our infographic competition for a chance to win prizes for your school.

Completing the Questionnaire

Teachers must register before a class can take the new questionnaire, although you are free to try the questionnaire beforehand using your school LEA and ID code. Once all the class have taken the questionnaire a teacher can request all the data back via the website. The returned data can be used within a class project or in conjunction with one of our resources...it is up to you.

As soon as a class have taken the new questionnaire they can enter our competition.

The Infographic Competition

We're looking for infographics based on one of the themes from the questionnaire. Pupils can either use their own class data to produce their infographic and/or incorporate/utilise appropriate secondary data.

Below you will find some guidance followed by the rules of the competition and our criteria.

Guidance & Criteria

An infographic provides a quick means of presenting information, data or knowledge in a clear understandable way using a combination of illustrations, graphs, tables and text. If you would like to learn more the following links may be useful:

Special attention should be given to the criteria below.

- Relevancy to one of the questionnaire themes.
- Narrative/message/storyline - the message must be clear, easily understood and insightful.
- Layout, design and creativity – a clear and visual style that is not overly reliant on text.
- Originality and innovation – in terms of both the nuance of the theme and in the delivery.
- Statistical understanding – appropriate use of data with appreciation of data variables.
- Best practice – graphs and tables should be used appropriately (e.g. use of colour, size, layout, legends, titles, explanation etc.)

Example

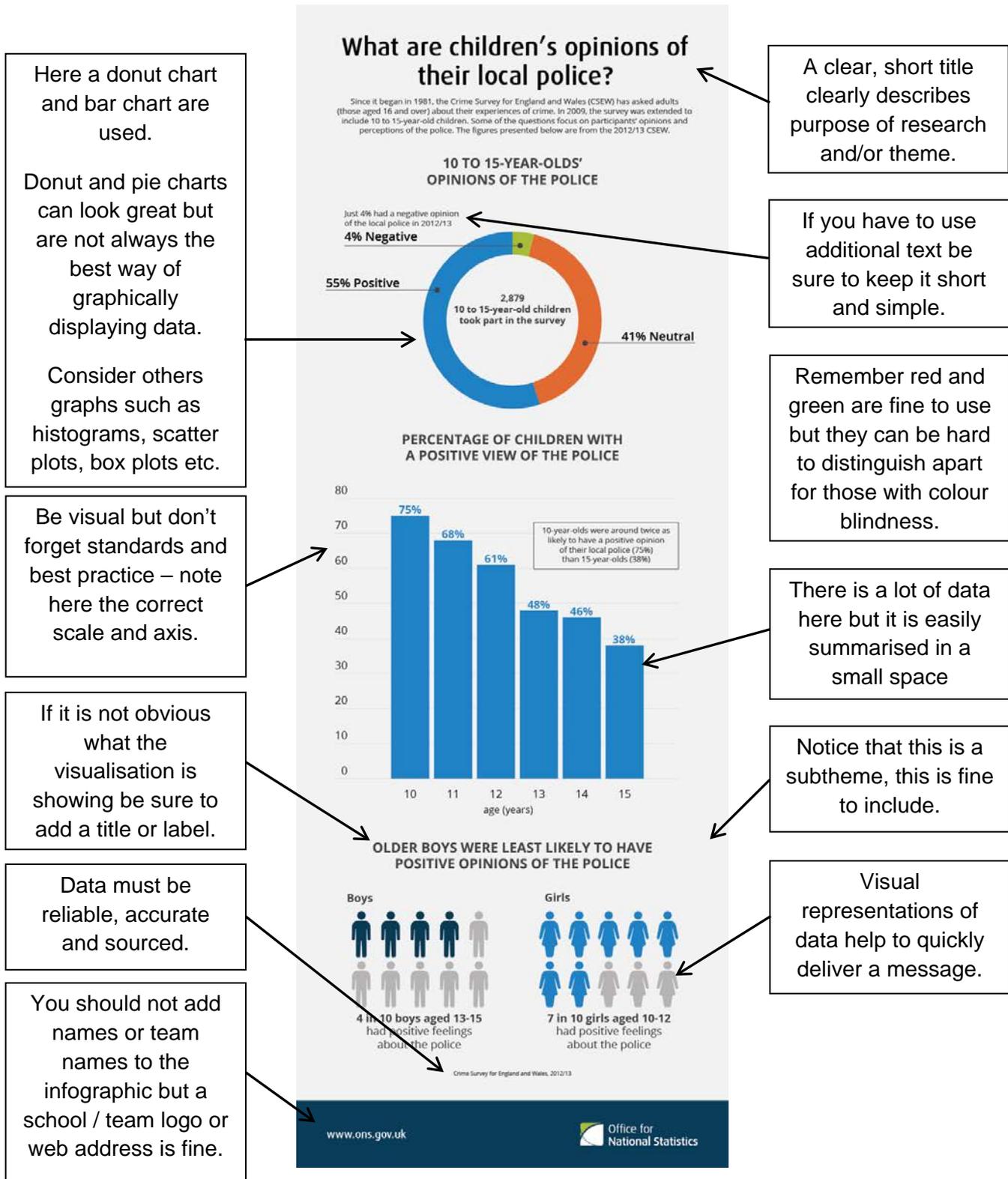


Figure 1: Children's opinions of their local police in England and Wales in the 2012/13 Crime Survey for England and Wales infographic. Produced by the UK Office for National Statistics and distributed under a Creative Commons licence.

Creating

So long as the final submission adheres to the rules (below) participants may use any method to produce their submission, such as: Photoshop, Illustrator, Excel, Word, photography/scanning.

Entry Details

- This is a free competition open to all UK secondary schools
- A single submission should be from a team within a class (maximum 5 teams per class).
- A team may make only one submission.
- Team should consist of no less than 5 pupils and no more than a whole class.
- The team making the submission must have taken the 2015-2016 CensusAtSchool Questionnaire.
- There are two bands of submission:
 - Band 1 – Y7 to Y9 England and Wales (P7 to S2 Scotland, P7 to Y9 Northern Ireland)
 - Band 2 - Y10 to Y11 England and Wales (S3 to S4 Scotland, Y10 to Y11 Northern Ireland)

Times

- Submissions can be made from the 2nd of November 2015.
- Submissions after the **25th of April 2016** will not count and will not be considered by the judges.
- Winners will be selected on the week ending the 1st of May 2016 and announced shortly after.

Judging Panel

- The judging panel will be specially selected from Plymouth University staff.
- The deliberations for each submission will not be published (apart from winning entries).
- The judges' decision is final.

Additional Information

- Make sure you have backups of any work submitted.
- Upon submission teachers give permission for their pupils' work to be displayed at various ICSE events, in publications, promotional material, and on the internet. Copyright remains with the school.

Rules

It is recommended that the following points are used as a check list prior to any submission.

Submission

- Submissions should broadly follow a topic related to the 2015-2016 CensusAtSchool Questionnaire.
- Teams are free to incorporate data from other sources so long as the source is clearly referenced.
- Submissions should seek to use data to tell a story and deliver a message.
- Graph, tables or illustrations may be used but text should be kept to a minimum.
- A short description (200 words or less) should separately accompany the submission.
- The team members or the class name must accompany the submission.
- The school, class or individual team members should not be identifiable from the submission itself.
- Submissions should be in English.
- Entries **must be submitted by teachers**, registered with CensusAtSchool (see website). Pupils, teams and classes do not need to register.

Technical

- The submission must be a static data visualisation (i.e. not animated, interactive or in 3D).
- Only electronic submissions submitted online or via email will be accepted.
- Any images used should be copyright free, have copyright permission from the holder or be available under a Creative Commons license.
- The maximum file size per submission should be no greater than 5MBs.
- The submission should ideally be in the format of a PDF (sized A4 to A3 landscape, portrait or square). If submitted as an image only JPEG or PNG will be accepted with minimum width/height 600px and maximum width/height 3500px).
